# WATER BAPTISM

Water baptism is the next important step in the first principles of the doctrine of Christ. Water baptism is not merely a form or a meaningless ceremony, but a definite experience in the life of a New Testament Christian, as recorded for us not only in the Gospels, but in the Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles. Hebrews 6:1-2; Acts 2:38-41

# 1. WHAT IS THE MEANING OF THE WORD "BAPTIZE"?

Baptism, or baptize, means "to dip, to plunge, to immerse". Mark 1:5; John 3:33; Acts 8:36-39. By definition and usage, the word means "to put into or under water so as to entirely immerse or submerge".

### 2. WHY HAVE THE ORDINANCE OF WATER BAPTISM? a.

Jesus commanded it. Mark 16:16; Matthew 28:16-20 **b.** Jesus was baptized. Matthew 3:13-17

- c. The Apostles commanded it. Acts 2:37-45; Acts 10:44-48
- d. If we love Him, we will keep His commandments. John 14:15
- **e**. We validate our faith by our obedience. James 2:17-18

# 3. WHO IS THIS ORDINANCE FOR?

In every Scripture listed below it will be seen that people *heard*, *believed* and *received the Word*, and then were *baptized*. Repentance and faith always preceded water baptism. Therefore it is a *believer's baptism"*.

- **a**. "He that believeth and is baptized..." Mark 16:16
- **b.** The Samaritans believed and were baptized. Acts 8:12-15
- c. The eunuch believed and was baptized. Acts 8:35-38
- **d.** Peter commanded that the Gentiles be baptized. Acts 10"47-48
- **e.** The Ephesians disciples believed and were baptized. Acts 19:4, 5. Also read Acts 9:17-18; 16:30-34; 18:8

Water baptism is an essential part of obedience; it is not optional. To refuse water baptism is to live in disobedience to the revealed Word of God.

**NOTE:** Water baptism involved a confession of faith in the Lordship of Christ, Acts 8:36-39; Romans 10:9-10. The prerequisites of baptism are repentance, faith, and confession (these clearly exclude infant baptism).

# 4. WHAT IS THE MEANING OF THIS ORDINANCE?

Water baptism is a symbolic yet real spiritual experience. It is baptism into His:

- **a.** Death Romans 6:3, 4.5.11
- **b.** Burial Colossians 2:12
- **c**. Resurrection Colossians 3:1; Romans 6:4,5

Baptism is identification with Christ. In salvation we accept Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. In water baptism we are identified with this triune fact.

- **a**. By baptism we stand as "dead".
- **b.** By immersion we bury the "dead".
- **c**. By raising <u>out</u> of the water, we rise to walk in newness of life.
